OUR MISSION

Reach every learner

Applications are welcome for children aged 5 to 18 with no distance limit, while our teaching remains rooted in the local community.

TEACHING

Traditional and focused

Teacher modelling, repeat recitation, individual reading, correction and new line or paragraph targets each day.

OUR TEAM

Nine educators

One female headteacher and owner, four female teachers and four male teachers.

SAFEGUARDING

Secure environment

Girls and boys learn with appropriately matched teachers in a secure building supported by CCTV monitoring.



Your child's learning week

Teaching days	Monday to Friday
Session one	16:30 to 17:30
Session two	17:30 to 18:30
Class size	Usually 15 to 20 children
Friday	Islamic studies replaces the regular Qur'an lesson. Topics include Seerah, Fiqh, Aqeedah, duas and Islamic manners.

Qaida Foundations

Ages 5 to 10, £40 per child each month. Children develop Arabic letter recognition, joining, pronunciation, reading confidence, short duas and Islamic manners.

Qur'an classes

Ages 11 to 18, £45 per child each month. Girls and boys learn in separate classes with appropriately matched teachers. Children starting Qur'an complete a short reading and recitation assessment to ensure their basics are strong.

Payment

Deadline: Payment is due by the last day of every month. Please pay earlier wherever possible. Payment is accepted by direct debit or bank transfer. Fees remain the same and payable in full regardless of attendance or the reason for absence.

Terms and closure

The madrassah runs throughout school terms and has very few periods of closure. Closures are mainly around Eid or caused by venue availability. Confirmed updates are shared through WhatsApp, the website blog and live chat.



Daily expectations

Attend promptly

Arrive on time and collect promptly after class.

Come prepared

Bring the correct books. Phones must be switched off and out of sight.

Good character

Politeness, kindness, respect and tidiness are expected.

Bathroom independence

Children must be able to use the bathroom independently.

Keep access clear

Do not block driveways, entrances or traffic when parking.

No chewing

Chewing gum and food are not permitted in class.

Homework

Practise the lines or paragraphs set by the teacher each day.

Collection changes

Tell the madrassah in advance if another responsible adult will collect.
